

SUDEP Action Day – 23 October

WHAT IS SUDEP ACTION DAY?

SUDEP Action Day is a special day which brings organisations and people together to raise awareness of SUDEP worldwide.

Launched by <u>SUDEP Action</u> on 23 October 2014 (as SUDEP Awareness Day), it shines a light on the largest cause of death in people with epilepsy, helping empower people through increased awareness and raise funds for SUDEP research.

ARE YOU SUDEPAWARE?

APPROXIMATELY 15,000 PEOPLE IN AUSTRALIA ARE DIAGNOSED WITH EPILEPSY EACH YEAR.

SUDDEN UNEXPECTED DEATH IN EPILEPSY (SUDEP) IS WHEN A PERSON WITH EPILEPSY DIES SUDDENLY AND PREMATURELY AND NO OTHER CAUSE OF DEATH IS FOUND.

THERE ARE APPROXIMATELY 300 EPILEPSY-RELATED DEATHS IN AUSTRALIA EACH YEAR.

Sudden Unexpected Death in Epilepsy (SUDEP) is when a person with epilepsy dies suddenly and prematurely and no reason for death is found. This does not include those who die in status epilepticus and those who die from a seizure-related accident.

Reducing risk plays a big part in epilepsy management. Reducing risk can include taking anti-











seizure medication as prescribed, avoiding triggers, getting adequate sleep, avoiding excessive alcohol or illicit drugs and ensure family and carers are trained in seizure first aid.
