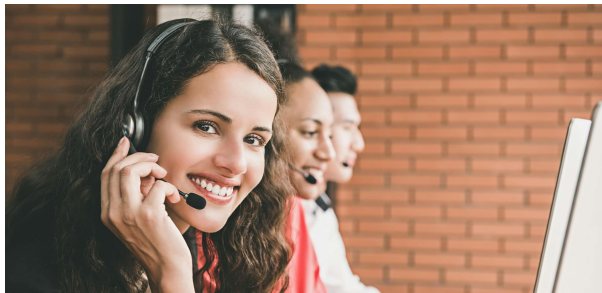


Employment Support
