

# Funding and Epilepsy



This section provides information about government funding and supports which may be available to people living with epilepsy and/or those who care for them.

Disability Support Services (DSS) are available to people who have physical, intellectual or sensory disabilities which are likely to last longer than 6 months, and which limit their ability to function to the point that ongoing support is needed. Some neurological conditions and developmental disabilities (such as autism) are also eligible for DSS. Psychiatric, personal health or age-related conditions as well as injuries are not eligible for DSS. Local district health boards and ACC pay for support services for these conditions.
