MESSAGE FROM PHARMAC

In July 2024, Pharmac asked for feedback on funding zonisamide, a medicine used in the treatment of epilepsy, through Pharmac's 2023/24 Annual Invitation to Tender.

More work needs to be done before a decision on the tender for this treatment.

This means that the timeframe for making zonisamide available will be delayed. It is unlikely to be in 2025.

What an amazing out pouring of talent to celebrate this special day. Purple Day truly is a special day to connect with our community and educators, and raise epilepsy awareness.

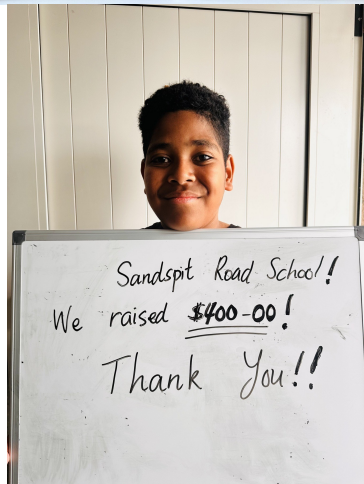
